Use COLOR for Curb Appeal

Does your home have curb appeal...that certain something that adds a "sparkle" to your home and beckons buyers to come inside?

Curb appeal creates an immediate impact on homebuyers. Whether it is pots of colorful flowers on the patio, a manicured and lush lawn, vibrant blooms climbing on an arbor... color creates an emotional connection, and a memorable first impression! Best of all, flowers and plants are an economical, easy way to create "curb appeal" in no time at all!



Some suggestions that will add curb appeal to your home:

- Plant redwood boxes with a variety of flowering plants and place on your porch, patio or walkways.
- Train a flowering vine to climb your porch railing or a trellis over the garage door.
- Buy ready-made "color spot" clay pots and scatter them around the yard for instant color.
- Plant bright trays of flowers along the front fence.
- Be sure your yard is maintained to keep lawns and trees looking healthy, and walkways clear of debris.

Remodeling?? Choose Well!

Finding the right contractor is essential in achieving the best quality and value for your money. It will take a little research, but will be well worth it in the end.

Ask around. Check in with friends and neighbors whose remodels you like. Ask for the name of their contractor and ask questions about the process—as well as how he/she was to work with. Decide exactly what you want done and write it

down. Plans may be altered (by agreement) along the way, but you need to clearly define your expectations so things can't be misinterpreted.

Do you want to work with a General Contractor who will manage the entire job, or will you manage the subcontractors yourself? Either way, make sure to get at least 3 bids. Most importantly, meet the contractor at your home to get a feel for personality and work style. A good match is vital! Consider how much privacy you want to maintain while the work is being done, whether they will bring in a porta-potty or use your bathroom, how the site will be left at the end of each workday. Will the general contractor be on site—if not, how will you reach him? What if the project takes longer than expected? Value is gained in many ways—and not always with the cheapest bid!

Agree on a timeframe for the work to be done and get it in writing. Finally, ask for references and make sure the contractor is bonded and insured...and always, check their references as well as calling the local Better Business Bureau to see if they have any disputes or complaints on record.

Make sure to hold back the final payment until the job is complete *to your satisfaction*.

With patience, perseverance and a little luck, you'll be well on your way to a happy ending!

PICNIC POTATO SALAD

- 5 pounds red potatoes
 - 1 cup mayonnaise
 - 1/2 cup Miracle Whip salad dressing
 - 1/4 cup milk
 - 2 Tbsp. yellow mustard
 - Salt & pepper to taste
 - 1 bunch green onions, sliced
 - 1 bunch radishes, cleaned and sliced
 - 6 hard boiled eggs, sliced
- Boil potatoes until tender and peel when cool enough to handle. Blend mayonnaise, Miracle Whip, milk and mustard in a large bowl until smooth. The dressing will be fairly thin. Toss all together. Add salt and pepper to taste. Serves 10.
